Transformative Recreation®, which serves as one of the cornerstones of our success in helping disadvantaged kids to thrive. CLK works year round to provide opportunities for children and youth from low-income families to build skills and resiliency through social recreational programming. The Transformative Recreation® program model is designed to support the development of three key skill areas: physical, social and character skills. The emphasis is on building trust and

communication with participants and their parents, celebrating accomplishments and providing support whenever challenges are encountered.





CLK works closely with each child to evaluate their needs and strengths before participation in programs and assess personal growth afterwards.

This not only ensures a thorough understanding of how to best serve each child, but also affords opportunities to measure success and refine program delivery as needed. One of the secrets to CLK's success is the amount of training and orientation given to volunteers and staff members so that they can be prepared and patient with the children and youth with whom they are engaged. The emphasis is on building trust and communication with participants and their parents, celebrating accomplishments and providing support whenever challenges are encountered. The organization also takes pride in its high adult to youth ratios, which facilitates a stable, positive environment for all. A crucial element of Transformative Recreation® is the "Active Pursuit" process. By providing personalized attendance reminders and participation support,

programs enjoy high enrollment retention which leads to individual success. Through the development of strong, trusting bonds and targeted skill development goals, CLK's Transformative Recreation® programs allow children and youth to build long-term resiliency.

CLK measures skill development using two evaluation tools. The first is the

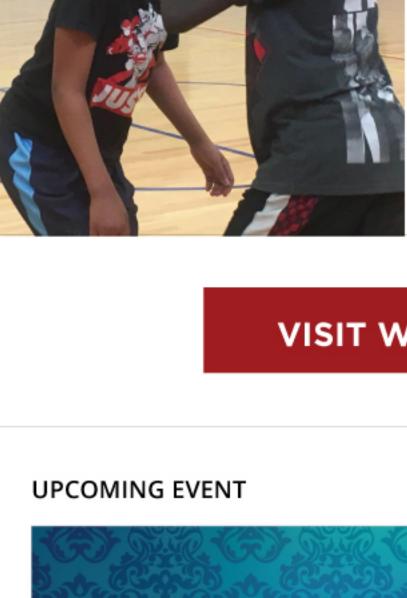
Transformative Recreation Skills Evaluation, which program volunteers and

staff use at the end of a program cycle to measure the specific development

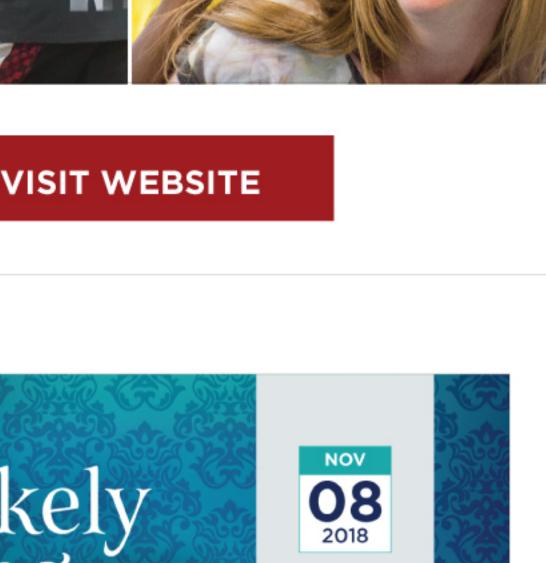
