CLK provides year round services to children and youth through an excellent camp experience and strategically located city recreational opportunities through the STAR (Skills Through Arts and Recreation) program. Our mandate is to provide high quality recreation opportunities that help children and youth build the skills necessary for developing long-term resiliency.

Christie Lake Kids is an organization committed to reflecting the communities we serve, and we are deeply committed to equity in employment opportunities. Job Summary

The Soccer Instructor will lead soccer skill building sessions and activities for campers aged 8-13, creating a safe, fun, and educational environment. This role involves engaging campers through skill-building practices and motivational activities that promote teamwork, sportsmanship, and the development of social, emotional, and physical skills. In addition to facilitating soccer sessions, the instructor will also support the Program Director with evening programs. The instructor may also be assigned to support campers who require extra assistance, fill in for other staff members, or provide care for campers with complex needs.

Duties and Responsibilities

Including but not limited to:

Instructor Duties

- Conduct soccer drills focused on dribbling, passing, and shooting techniques during designated sessions.
- Facilitate 4 soccer practice sessions a day with different groups based on ages and with the support of the Camp Program Director.
- Lead dynamic warm-up and stretching sessions each morning to prepare campers for physical activities.
- Foster a positive atmosphere that encourages teamwork, effort, and sportsmanship.
- Supervise campers during soccer activities, ensuring safety and engagement.
- Utilize a skill development tool to assess and track each camper's progress in skill



building.

- Organize and lead a soccer competition at the end of camp, providing campers the opportunity to showcase their newly acquired skills.
- Facilitate team-building exercises to promote group cohesion and communication.
- Reflect on the day's sessions with campers, encouraging them to share their experiences and achievements.
- Mentor and support staff and campers in developing their soccer skills and teamwork abilities.
- Support the Program Director in the facilitation and supervision of evening programs.

General Duties:

- In collaboration with other staff; provide direct care/supervision of children/youth while acting as a positive role model
- Supervision includes; mealtimes, daily programs, all-camp programs, clubs, special activities, campfires, bedtime, etc.
- Clearly explain, monitor and support the expectations of campers.
- Create a positive and supportive atmosphere within camp.
- Guide campers toward full participation in the wide range of programs
- Supervise and participate in daily lessons, activities and programs while actively engaging with campers
- Assist in leading activities throughout the day as assigned by Camp Program Director.
- Temporarily cover or replace Senior Staff in their roles as assigned by Camp Management.
- Work collaboratively with staff to ensure campers are supported throughout the day
- In collaboration with the Camp Program Director, complete camper skill development tool at the end of each session
- Carry out any other responsibilities as designated by Camp Management.

Expectations

- Work in a manner that preserves confidentiality and encourages risk management
- Engage with campers actively and support their participation in all camp activities.
- Incorporate and strengthen collaborative and interdisciplinary teamwork
- Maintain professional working relationships with all team members
- Professionally attend to all assignments and supervisory duties
- Respect and value intersectional inclusion, diversity equity and accessibility
- Contribute to the organization's activities to collect, analyze and report on data and relevant information.
- Contribute to the organization's work by participating in meetings as necessary



- Participate in general end of summer wrap-up tasks
- Maintain a clean and hygienic personal cabin environment
- Act as a mentor for Counsellors.
- Fill in or support in other areas in the event that a team member is pulled away or sick

Desired Qualifications

- Enrollment in a post-secondary program in a related field (ie. Outdoor education, Education, Social Work, Child and Youth Care, Child Studies, etc.)
- Experience in coaching or instructing soccer, preferably in a camp or educational setting.
- Knowledge of soccer fundamentals and coaching techniques.
- Experience working in camp/overnight camp setting
- Ability to lead and motivate campers of various skill levels.
- Background in evaluating skill development.
- Be of excellent character, modeling honesty, integrity and respect
- Possess enthusiasm, energy, patience and a sense of humour
- Experience working with children in a dynamic outdoor setting
- Demonstrated skill in working with children/youth who present with a variety of complex needs or behaviours
- Ability to relate well to peers, to be a team player and, to give/receive feedback
- Confidence in leading activities and groups
- Current Standard First Aid with CPR-C

Physical Requirements

The ideal candidate must be able to complete all physical requirements of the job with or without a reasonable accommodation

Due to the nature of summer camp, candidates must be able to:

- Spend approx. 75% of each day outdoors and active (walking, swimming, canoeing, participating in programs etc.) with limited stationary time
- Occasionally transport supplies/equipment up to 40 lbs
- Work outdoors in a variety of weather conditions (heat, high sun exposure, rain etc.)
